3. Hampton Carousel (757) 727-6381
The renovated wooden carousel operates from Spring to Fall. It is one of 170 remaining antique carousels in the United States.

A highly recommended narrated tour. Tour includes the Hampton Roads area, Ft. Wool and the Norfolk Naval Base.

5. Sandy Bottom Nature Park (757) 825-4657
Camping sites, hiking, boating, biking, picnic shelters, gift shop and nature programs available.

History of space and air travel. Tours available, gift shop and over 100 hands-on exhibits. Visit the IMAX theatre

7. Buckroe Beach (757) 727-6347
3/4 mile of wide beach and gentle surf on the Chesapeake Bay. Picnic shelters available.

8. Grandview Nature Preserve/Estuary (757) 727-6347
Good for hiking, and watching wildlife. Preserve is 2 1/2 miles long.
