
Get Outdoors.

The Power of Girl Scouts for Girls.

Now, more than ever, girls face unique challenges in school and in social settings. Our proven Girl Scout program is based on years of research about girls' development and is designed to:

- · Close the confidence gap (research is clear—it starts for girls at age 6, when they start to believe that they are less capable than boys, and it accelerates in middle school and continues through college);
- Develop and fortify girls' belief in their identities as leaders;
- Inoculate girls against the constant drum of media that tells them they must be perfect;
- Strengthen them to stand up to the peer pressure and bullying that girls experience starting in elementary school.

Girl Scouts Is Affordable and Valuable.

Joining Girl Scouts is easy! Once you register, you'll be able to look through our Troop Opportunity Catalog to select a troop. Girls may also be individual members. The cost of an annual membership is \$25, a fee that goes directly to Girl Scouts of the USA to cover insurance and other national costs. Local troops may assess additional dues or fees to offset supply and activity costs. You can go online to our website at gsccc.org for full instructions.

Celebrating Spirituality and Faith.

Girl Scouts is welcoming and inclusive to members of all faiths. Everything in Girl Scouting is based on the Girl Scout Promise and Law, which include many principles and values that are common across religions. Because we understand that religious instruction is at the center of many families and communities, we invite Girl Scouts to take spiritual journeys via their faith's religious recognitions. Girls may earn the My Promise, My Faith pin. Girls explore the connections between the Girl Scout Law and teachings from their faith. This pin can be earned each year. Requirements for this pin are included in The Girl's Guide to Girl Scouting for all levels.





Girls Love Earning Badges and Patches!

Girl Scouts of all grade levels can earn badges! Badges are awards girls earn by completing skill-building activities and can be worn on the front of the uniform, while patches are given to Girl Scouts for participating in fun events, activities or other programs.
