

## Guidelines for Troop Cookie Stand at a Private Home

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- Cookie Stands will be considered a troop booth if there are any Girl Scouts participating who do not reside in the home.
- Cookie Stands can **only** be hosted by a registered and background-checked adult Girl Scout who **owns or rents** the home.
- Cookie Stands **MUST** be listed in eBudde as a troop booth and **MUST** be approved by the SUCC.
- Troops are to submit their request in writing (email) for a Cookie Stand **at least 48 hours in advance** to the SU Cookie Coordinator **and** Chris Ramos-Smith ([chrisr@gsgccc.org](mailto:chrisr@gsgccc.org)) – all requests must include a copy of the homeowner's or renter's insurance.\* *If the homeowner or renter already has a CURRENT policy on file with the council, they do NOT need to resubmit.*
- All GSGCCC booth rules, ratios and etiquette apply! Details are listed in the Troop Cookie Guide.

- Additional host homeowner requirements:
  - The stand must be at least 6 feet from the street and on the homeowner's property.
  - They must have permission from their HOA (if applicable).
  - They must have appropriate city permits (if applicable).
  - They must have permission from their landlord (if applicable).

*\*A minimum of \$100,000 in liability insurance is required of all homeowners or renters.*
