Once you become a Girl Scout, you will receive an invitation to register for this series.

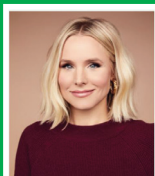

Go over the benefits of recycling:

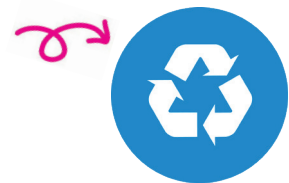
- Recycling protects our valuable planet.
