## OR

- Do a safety walk or safety hunt in the water park. Choose five elements and answer the following questions about each one:
  1. What is the minimum height and/or weight requirement?
  2. Name an item that is permitted at each element.
  3. Name at least one item that is not permitted at each.
  4. What is kept in each lifeguards fanny pack?
  5. What do the different number of whistle blows mean that lifeguards use to communicate with each other?
- Investigate career paths at the lodge: lifeguards, maintenance, education, group sales, spa, communications/media relations, food & beverage, by meeting and speaking with staff members at the lodge.

## TAKE ACTION
