Are you ready to make your voice heard and help shape the future of Girl Scouts in our council? The GSCCC Girl Scout Advisory Board is your chance to do just that! We're looking for up to ten high school Girl Scouts who want to share ideas, help plan important initiatives, and influence the programs and decisions that affect girls like you.

As an Advisory Board member, you'll build leadership skills, work alongside decision-makers, and gain real-world experience that prepares you for future opportunities—all while making a difference right now. Open to Girl Scouts in 9th grade and up, the board connects you directly to the council's CEO, giving you a powerful voice in shaping programs that matter to girls.

Members serve one-year terms starting October 1, which can be renewed once, or until high school graduation, whichever comes first. Join us and help make Girl Scouts even stronger for girls everywhere!

Application Qualifications

- Enrolled in 9th-12th grade in the fall of each membership year.
- Registered as a Girl Scout at the time of application (if accepted, Girl Scouts must renew their membership by the start of the new membership year, October 1).
- Must have been a Girl Scout for a minimum of 2-years.
- Genuine interest in taking on a leadership role on the national level of Girl Scouts.
- Ability to communicate with your peers and adults.
- Ability to work well independently and on a team.

Responsibilities

- Attend monthly meetings (except July and December). Meetings are scheduled typically on a weekend and may be conducted either virtually or in-person. The schedule will be determined at the October meeting.
- Commit to attending at least 7 meetings during their term.
- Able to attend 2 input gathering opportunities during their term (i.e. Service Unit event, troop meeting or Council program) to listen to other Girl Scout members and bring feedback to the Advisory Board.
- Attend one Council Board meeting during their term.
- Participate actively in scheduled meetings with other Girl Scout Advisory Board members and GSCCC staff partners.
- Communicate directly with GSCCC staff and volunteer facilitators about the advisory board work, possible absences, etc.
- Work in groups and independently to complete and present research and tasks.
- Perform related responsibilities as assigned.
- Maintain the confidentiality of advisory board work until such time as it is released for general information and abide by the Council's conflict of interest and Code of Ethics policies.

Application Timeline/Process

June 1-August 31	Application period open to all eligible Girl Scouts. Email completed application to sunnys@gscucc.org
September 1-15	Application review and evaluation period. GSCCC will send decision emails to all applicants
September 21-30	Interviews for selected applicants.
October 1-5	Final selection and notification to applicants.
October 5-31	New members of the Girl Scout Advisory Board join their first meeting.
