Juliettes can have experiences uniquely tailored to their interests at the schedule and pace that works best for them.



What is a Girl Scout Juliette?

Girl Scout Juliettes are individually registered Girl Scouts who choose not to participate in the troop format but still have access to a robust offering of Girl Scout experiences and opportunities. Juliettes are active, independent, self-confident girls who want to be part of something larger—Girl Scouts! It's a great way to take the lead in the Girl Scout experience and pursue activities that match individual interests and schedule.

There are many ways to have fun and explore the world in Girl Scouts. It all depends on interests: earn badges while experimenting with science in the outdoors; make new friends at summer camp; travel locally and abroad; explore interests through series and events; and learn what it takes to run a business in our Cookie Program.

Every Girl Scout has opportunities to build skills and confidence in STEM, the Outdoors, Life Skills, and Entrepreneurship—the pillars of the Girl Scout Leadership Experience.



Her Best Year Yet

During the course of a Girl Scout year, Juliettes will participate in a variety of activities that are Girl Scout led. Supported by adult volunteers (like you), Juliettes work to set goals and make plans to do the things they're most interested in.

Activities might include:

Badge or Journey Earning Activities

Girl Scout awards and badges are a great way for Juliettes to explore their interests and learn new skills—and to remember every adventure by proudly wearing them on their uniforms as they show the world what they've accomplished.

Fall Product & Girl Scout Cookie Program

In addition to honing entrepreneurial skills, Juliettes have the opportunity to set goals and earn start-up funds for Girl Scout activities, community service, or Take Action projects.

Outings

Juliettes learn by doing and getting out into the world! Outings might include visiting a business, going camping, hiking, or even practicing life skills at a restaurant.

Travel

In Girl Scouting, travel presents girls the opportunity to learn about themselves, other cultures, new places, and the outdoors as they prepare, plan, and budget for their trip.

Community Service and Take Action Projects

Whether it's through planting a garden, painting a mural, or launching a letter-writing campaign, Girl Scouts make the world a better place.

Bridging Events

When Girl Scouts advance to the next Girl Scout level, they cross a bridge to symbolize a connection between past Girl Scout experiences and future Girl Scout adventures.

Parents/Caregivers will:

Register your Girl Scout Juliette.

Go to <u>www.gsccc.org</u> and click on "**MyGS**" to register/renew membership and pay the annual membership dues, which provides insurance coverage for Girl Scout activities.

By registering yourself, you become a Girl Scout entitled to member benefits, including access to free training, activity accident insurance, and communications from Girl Scouts. Your child will see your commitment to their growth and before you know it, you'll be growing too!

Transitioning Membership

Girl Scouts can transition from Juliettes into a troop or vice versa at any time within the membership year (October 1-September 30). Register (pay membership dues) only once a year. For assistance in transitioning your membership, please email <u>customercare@gsccc.org</u>.

Girl Scout Juliette families provide funds for special events and activities. Juliettes can also participate in the our Fall Product and Cookie programs to help cover the costs of their experiences. Financial assistance is available for uniforms, membership dues, camps, and events.
