



Explore Chrysler Museum of Art

Visit the Chrysler Museum of Art, 1 Memorial Place, Norfolk, VA 23510. Admission and parking are free; check <u>chrysler.org</u> for hours.





DISCOVER

- Pick up a visitor guide on your way into the Museum.
 - 1. What year was the Museum built?
 - 2. What was the original name of the Museum?
 - 3. 3. What are the guidelines for taking photos?
- Visit the Egyptian Gallery. Describe the sarcophagus of Psamtik-Seneb. What is inscribed on the sarcophagus?
- Visit the Perry Glass Studio, across the street from the Museum, during a glass-making demonstration. What did you learn?
- Find the Museum Shop. In the Museum Shop, we carry many items that relate to the Chrysler Museum's art collection. Look through the post-cards, write down the artist and the title of an artwork, and see if you can find that work in the Museum.
- In the Glass Galleries find the cameo plates created by Thomas & George Woodall (look in the far-left corner or ask a Gallery Host for help). After reading the label, answer the questions below.
 - 1. What two colors of glass are used to make the Woodall plates?
 - 2. Which plate was created first?
 - 3. Can you find anything else in the gallery created by the Woodall brothers? If so, what did you find?
- On the second floor, there is a painting of the artist Susan Watkins by William Merritt Chase (Gallery 218). Nearby is a painting made by Susan Watkins. Compare and contrast the two paintings.

CONNECT

- Along with its permanent collection, which is always on view, the Museum hosts many temporary exhibitions each year. Find a temporary exhibition in the Museum. What is the title of the exhibition? What is it about? What did you like the most? Why?
- Visit the African Gallery. Identify three animals on the Kponyugu (Helmet Mask). What animal would you add to the mask? Why?
- Visit the American Art Galleries (209-213). What is your favorite artwork (painting, sculpture, etc.) Why?
- Walk outside of the Museum. Look at the sculptures. Which one is your favorite? Why?

TAKE ACTION

- Museums exist to serve their communities. At the Chrysler Museum we host many events such as Family Festivals, First Thursdays, weddings, and art-making workshop, like the Second Saturday Art Pop-Up. What kind of special event do you think community members like you would enjoy? Plan an event at the Museum and write down a schedule for that day.
- Create a flyer about the Chrysler Museum of Art. Pick out the best aspects of the Museum that you think would appeal to your friends. Present it to your Girl Scout Troop.
- The Museum grows through feedback from its visitors, both positive and negative. Discuss with your troop the best thing that you loved about the museum. Suggest one thing that we can improve.
