#### Winter Fun: Ice Science

Equipment: Small balloons, bubble solution or other liquid soap, food coloring, sugar or salt.

Procedure: Make use of those freezing temperatures (or use a freezer) and explore the science of ice! Blow bubbles when it's cold out and watch them freeze before they pop. Freeze balloons filled with food coloring and water and open them up to observe the patterns of how ice forms. Explore what happens when you put your ice balloon in a bucket of water, or try adding sugar or salt to your balloons before freezing them!
